Nate had some wonderfully innovative ideas about collection organization, but we decided it made sense to stay consistent with the larger PCCLD collection.

Charlene is working with History Colorado, El Pueblo Museum and others organizations from Denver to bring a documentary produced by the Denver Post and others called, 'Chicanas, Nurturers and Warriors," to Pueblo.

Charlene continues working with Carolyn Lowery on the transcription of oral histories and she will soon start on the ones about the building or the Pueblo Reservoir.

Charlene and Hannah have been working on the vertical files and have caught up categorizing them and Hannah is almost finished filing them. The Pandemic files have been turned over to Cecily since many of them are about the library's handling of the pandemic. This is being done for historical documentation as we have lack of documentation for the Spanish Flu of 1918. With the lack of the Pueblo Chieftain reporting very little local news we are looking for other sources to use for the vertical files. A new "Star Journal" may be published in the future. Meanwhile if anyone has suggestions for other newspapers to use for our vertical files please recommend them.

Charlene has selected ten more theses to be bound and Hannah is preparing them for the bindery as well as the last batch of magazines which will be about another 150 magazines.

Charlene sent the last of the orders for this year's book budget. Among them is a DVID on Damon Runyon produced by John Johnson and a book on stories about Pueblo published by storyteller, Jane Milne.

Purchased the last poster available on musicians of Pueblo from Frank Arteaga. These are very rare and should help in the project CU-Boulder is doing called Soundscapes on Pueblo musicians

Charlene has been answering a larger amount of questions coming in on AskUs, as probably other members of our staff have been doing, including topics such as Mutual Society groups in Pueblo, Pueblo's connection to the Ludlow Massacre and Charles and Molly Goodnight.

Blake continued processing of the CRAA collection, entering information into ArchivesSpace while Cecily was on leave. Blake worked with SER volunteer Gaola to create an inventory spreadsheet of published works in the collection, to add to the finding aid in ASpace. Blake processed material in the photographic slides series, processing the entirety of the Buckles, Crandall, Foster, Murphy, and Wagner subseries, with work beginning on the Rudolph subseries. Approximately 50 of the published works have been added to Archivesspace, with APA citations created for each entry. Work has also begun on the box of AV and computer materials containing VHS and compact cassettes, DVDs, and compact discs, with 25 items from the box being entered.
