
We frequently change-up displays around the service desk and at the end of each aisle to keep patrons engaged.

In this PAHS presentation, Rebecca Wood explained the importance of storytelling to language revitalization efforts amongst the Salish-Pend d'Oreille of western Montana, focusing on how these narratives build relationships to landscape, community, and culture.

# October 15, 6pm Partner Program with Arkansas Valley Audubon Society, 269 views Learning about Lichens: An Introduction to the Biology and Ecology of Common Colorado Species: Piper Boudart

This talk covered the foundations of lichen biology, including an overview of the lichen symbiosis and its evolution. It explored the morphology of lichens and the function each structure plays, as well as how to recognize these key features in the field. Participants will learn how to recognize several taxa common to Colorado. The talk will conclude with a discussion of lichen ecology and research applications.

### October 16, 12pm Launch of APR Counter Culture Exhibit (plays on PCCLD website) 156 views

A virtual exhibit created in conjunction with the All Pueblo Reads Program to highlight art movements, and cultural happenings during the Vietnam Era. This virtual exhibit was also used in unison with the book for Art and Social commentary in teachers school lesson plans.

### October 22, 5pm All Pueblo Reads Program, 243 views

Pueblo Art Walk: American Soldiers Project - Sally Lincoln

In 2007, artist Sally Lincoln set up her easel at the Veterans' Administration Medical Center to paint portraits of American veterans. She painted veterans who served in peacetime and others in multiple wars. This episode of Pueblo Art Walk will take a closer look at Sally Lincoln the artist, the veterans she painted and the significance of the project.

Charlene contacted Candid the new name for our non-profit section to see if they could extend to the public use from home because patrons are only being given an hour and that is not enough time to successfully write a grant. They gave us permission until December 31.

Charlene and Bree worked with the Bridging Borders program and had one of their programs in the Ryals Room on October 15. There were nine girls in attendance and seven mentors. Charlene gave the girls a tour and presentation of the Mural, "Corazon de Pueblo", on 2nd floor. The program scheduled for November 5 has been cancelled and will be held virtually.






