There were several patron requests from AskUs or messages left on our phone, unique topics. Two requests to see if we had a couple of theses, one by a local Ph.D., Bernice B. Zamora, "Mythopoeia of Chicano Poetry: An Introduction to Archetypes," written for Stanford University. We did not have it so I asked Thea if she could ILL it. She found five universities that have it but will not lend it out. Another patron asked for a thesis, Women and Property across Colonial America, A Comparison of Legal Systems in New Mexico and New York. Thea was able to find it through JSTOR. Sometimes we forget to look at our databases. There were two articles on Dr. Zamora found in our Academic Search Premier database and the patron was pleased to find these two articles.

Had a request from a patron for a topographic map of Canon City in 1889 when a survey was done and the map was printed in 1892. Was able to get it from the State Engineer's office.

Hannah and Charlene sent 30 more magazines to the bindery from our genealogy collection. There were also six more theses sent to be bound. All bound theses are being kept in the vault above the New Mexico Collection duplicates.

This must be the year for people discovering Cathay Williams known as a female Buffalo Soldier. Two patrons called asking about the resources we have on her and wanting to know how to contact Rebecca Atkinson, who has become quite an expert on this topic. Rebecca has given Charlene permission to give out her email address. There will be a PBS special on Cathay in Feb.

Charlene spent almost a whole day with two students from CU-Boulder who are working on "Soundscapes of the People," about Pueblo musicians. They went through 130 musicians and they highlighted the ones most likely to have biographies. They went through 18 years of Fiesta Day magazines cross referencing the most visible musicians over this time period. The students will organize what they gathered and will be back for more information from the vertical files.

Charlene continues working with Carolyn Lowrey on transcribing the oral histories and Blake has uploaded four new ones. Once Carolyn finishes with a six-part series she will start on the Fry-Arkansas tapes which are very important because this resulted in the Pueblo Reservoir being built.

Charlene was invited by Wade Broadhead, city planner, to accept a city proclamation at the by-weekly city council meeting, making September 16 - October 15 Hispanic Heritage Month in the city of Pueblo.
