

- Jill met with Bibliotheca to discuss self- check options for the upcoming year. Different demos with other companies are also being considered.

- More substitutes were hired in early August and a training was held. The subs have completed their shadowing shifts and are currently in the sub pool.

Collection Development

- All of the All Pueblo Reads books have arrived and are being processed. They will be distributed by September 14th.
- Digital collection use continues to steadily increase since the spring due to COVID. Maintaining a balanced budget for digital and physical collections continues to be a priority.




