Gains and Losses

 Once again, teen program attendance more than doubled - reflecting the excellent groundwork laid by our departing Teen Librarian Brooke Riedeman. The decrease comes from a few factors. In 2018, YS provided professional development at Central High School as well as two outreach storytime's that we did not provide this year. Mostly, however, a Friends grant in 2018 enabled us to provide snacks during Winter Break. Over 300 people attended those snack programs. We did not receive a similar grant this year, and so could not provide a snack program - but perhaps budget should be set aside for it in 2020.
