



EXHIBITS AND DISPLAYS

Since we were closed most of the month of January, we did not have any exhibits to count. However, we did continue to put some displays up in our front atrium as a sort of "window shopping" experience since our patrons seemed to enjoy that last month. We also expect to have a new Art Exhibit in February as we begin to reopen once more.



We also spent most of the month cleaning, weeding, and rearranging our collection to prepare for reopening! We have moved the teen hangout section to the northwest corner and the teen collection right in front of it. Since it was pretty sparse, we also worked on bringing new teen material in. That project involved shifting and subsequently cleaning and weeding the Adult books as well. Furthermore, we went through the entire children's collection cleaning and weeding as we inventoried items. Our next project will be cleaning and reorganizing the DVD collection.

Calls, Curbside, and Bundles

The Greenhorn library fielded 330 calls while serving as Call Center on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays of December. We also delivered books, kits, and program supplies to 141 patrons via our Curbside service.


Lamb Library

Programs

- Jennifer Sullivan (Branch Librarian) offered the following programs.
 - Early Literacy Kit2Go a monthly kit to help caregivers support developing literacy skills at home, with suggested activities categorized by the ECRR2 5 Practices of Talking, Singing, Playing, Reading, and Writing; including suggested books, songs, finger plays, coloring sheets, letter of the month, and materials & instructions for 2-3 crafts. Intended as a stand-alone, but

also coordinates with and complements the virtual storytimes this month. I also did an "unboxing" video to show people what is in this month's kit and talk a little about how it supports early literacy with 65+ views. Will give out 35 kits by the end of the month.







- Family Storytime weekly, Wednesdays at 10:30. The themes for January were/are Snow, Soup, Moose, and Yeti. These themes are also reflected in the monthly early literacy kit above. This month I've been playing around with using the green screen for backgrounds. Average about 25-30 views each on FB, 1-5 on YouTube. This is my second month of doing virtual storytime.
- Saturday Science I debuted this monthly STEM program for elementary ages on Jan 16th, which consists of a supply kit they can pick up in advance of the virtual program. This month's program was about special effects using mirrors and reflection, with the demonstration of a holographic image produced by a mirascope, and making a simple DIY Kaleidoscope. Only had 4 initially register, but have since given about 10 more. [Did not get the participation I'd hoped for, I think due to patrons being

unaware and having more difficulty with the new events calendar, which does not show program names, only colored dots and numbers, so that patrons have to click on each individual day to see the offerings, rather than being able to quickly scan the calendar. I've asked for more publicity for it on Facebook next month, and created flyers to hand out to let people know about it.]






