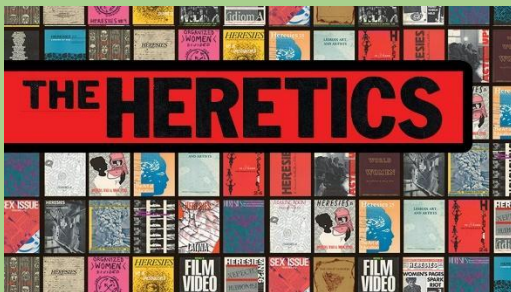
“Miss America: A History of America's Oldest Beauty Contest” (2002)

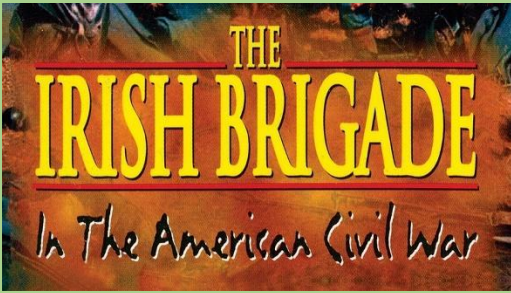

In Honor of Irish-American Heritage Month

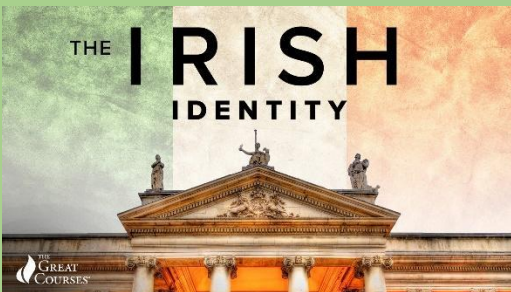
“The Irish Brigade - In the American Civil War” (2005)
