1,200 CB radios marked for ID

Identification marks were placed on about 1,200 citizen band radios and a number of television sets and stereos by members of the 10-2-4 CB Club and the Pueblo Police Department during the weekend, according to John Maltese, chairman of the club board.

Maltese said the club and the police department did the marking and listing for police records all day Saturday and Sunday afternoon in an attempt to cut down CB radio thefts and to improve the chances of returning stolen property to owners.

"It was such a success that we are planning to have another registration," Maltese said. He said persons who went to the Pueblo Bank and Trust drive-in lot also were given inventory sheets upon which they could list items of value in their homes. The lists are to be stored in a safe place so owners may identify items stolen in burglary, Maltese said.
