20 HERDS OF COWS TESTED

Pueblo County Dairy Stock Association
Averages 834 Pounds Milk Per Herd
In September

Twenty herds of dairy cows totaling 415 in number, were tested in this county during September according to the report of the Pueblo County Testing association. It found that the average pound of milk produced per cow was 834, there were 65 cows among the tested known as 40-pound cows. The average pound of butter fat per cow was 29.31 pounds, the highest.

Holding honors among these is "Hazel" owned by Floyd DeWitt. "Hazel" is a grade Holstein. Joe Gersick owns the high tested herd in the county, according to this report. His herd is composed of Holsteins and Guernseys, numbers 19 cows, each averaging 951 pounds of milk and 33 pounds butter fat.

Alfalfa in the stack, the report states, is selling for \$15 to \$18 a ton and ensilage from \$5 to \$7 a ton. A dry beet pulp at \$2 per hundred weight, bran at \$1.60 to \$1.90; from \$2 to \$2.20; barley \$2 to \$2.50, corn chop \$2 to \$2.40, cotton seed \$2.25 and linseed at \$3.25.

It was figured out that feed for each 100 pounds of milk during September amounted to \$1.40, which made the feed cost per pound of butter fat 29 cents.

Retail price of milk was 52 cents a gallon, while sweet cream butter the price of 50 cents per pound per fat.
