## Thieves steal journal written by toddler's slain mother

**COLORADO SPRINGS (AP)** — Three-year-old Matthew Lindsey of Colorado Springs lost his mother six days before Christmas last year, then survived a brain infection and surgery to remove a bullet lodged in his skull.

But his great-grandmother, Mary Padgett, hopes the toddler will not have to withstand the loss of priceless family mementos, including a journal his slain mother wrote especially for him.

On Saturday, thieves took the journal, a baby book and photos dating back to 1948, as Dianne Lindsey's family sorted through her belongings for the first time since her Dec. 19 shooting death.

The theft occurred at a self-storage site on north Nevada Avenue in Colorado Springs. The family left two boxes containing toys and the mementos outside the storage area for 15 minutes, believing they would be safe.

Padgett appealed to the thieves Monday, asking them to return the stolen treasures.

"These items are very precious to the family and will mean a great deal to Matthew later in life," Padgett said Monday. "These things aren't of interest or value to anyone but the family."

In December, a gunman burst into Dianne Lindsey's apartment, killing her with a .380-caliber pistol. Dora Lindsey, the victim's mother,
