

BUCKETEERS GIVEN PRISON SENTENCES

NEW YORK, June 19.—Edward M. Fuller and William F. McGee, confessed bucket shop operators today were sentenced to serve from one and one quarter to four years in Sing Sing prison for their offense. But United States Attorney Hayward indicated they might be old men before they got a chance to begin serving the sentences which with time off for good behavior, would amount to eleven months.

Fuller and McGee, jailed by federal court order for contempt in failing to turn over to the receiver in bankruptcy records of their firm, must clear themselves in the eyes of the federal authorities before they can leave Ludlow street jail to start serving their Sing Sing terms. Mr. Hayward declared, and the only way they can purge themselves, he added, is to yield up the records, with their possible evidence leading to a bucketshop ring, or at least to disclose the workings of this supposed ring and say who its members are.
