Three Ali Prepare

ALBUQUERQUE, —Three Alianza members were convicted in 1967 in connection with an attempted takeover of the northern New Mexico state fairgrounds camp surrendered to the military. The men begin serving their sentences in Albuquerque.

The three members of the Alianza land grant-claiming group were given today were: Alfredo Tijerina, the brother of Juan Lopez Tijerina; Alfredo Tijerina; and Esequiel Dominguez.

A fourth, Jerry N. Tijerina, is ordered to surrender to the FBI by 9 a.m. either in Albuquerque or Seattle, but failed to appear. U.S. Marshal's office in Albuquerque said.

The four, along with Juan Lopez Tijerina, were arrested last week.
