ried patients under the age of 18 found that 46 percent had not told their parents they were seeking help at family planning clinics, said Aida Torrez, senior research associate at the Alan Guttmacher Institute in New York. The institute is a privately funded corporation that does research on population issues.

The Post said that government investigators already have begun a nationwide check of records in some family planning clinics to determine whether they are using federal funds illegally to promote abortion as a means of birth control.

The Schweiker proposal, in explaining the reason for notifying parents, reads, "In our view . . . there is an assumption that these individuals will generally benefit from the exercise of a parent's mature judgment on their behalf."
