These women lived and worked throughout the U.S., welding, making bullets and doing a wide variety of factory jobs for the war effort. Hear about the Remington Arms Factory (1941-45) and the Denver Ordnance Plant (located at present day Denver Federal Center) which produced as many as six million bullets a day for U.S. troops.

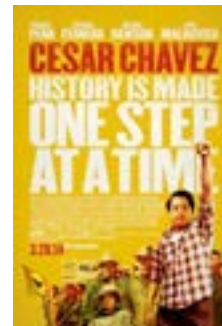

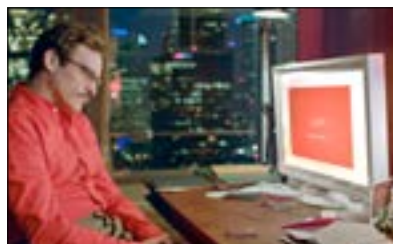
In honor of what would have been his 88th birthday, a biography of the civil-rights activist and labor organizer Cesar Chavez will be shown.

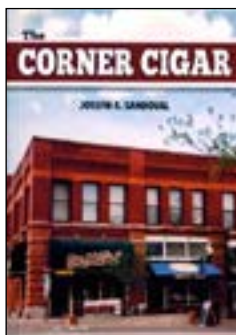

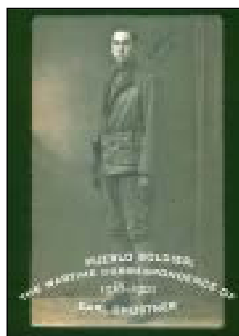
