I am proud of our local libraries. This includes almost everything about them: the buildings, the study and meeting spaces, the books and other materials and the computers and learning tools. But mainly I am

inspired by the people. Those who work here and those who use libraries: the women and men, the teens and tweens, the children and infants.

I have been part of the Pueblo City-County Library District for just over ten years now. Among my first tasks when I initially arrived back in 2004 was overseeing a study of our community and our libraries and creating a consensus long-range plan to move PCCLD forward. The goal was to provide the best possible public library service for our community.

In subsequent years, we focused on offering lifelong learning resources, access to information in all formats, well-equipped and maintained facilities, highly-trained employees and more. The result has been an explosion in library use here. In 2004, 877,299 people visited our libraries. 1,432,303 did so in 2014. In 2004, 35,162 people attended library programs and events. Participation in 2014 was 182,406. In 2004, 1,047,515 books and other materials were checked out from our libraries, 2,484,858






