Muse to Madness: The Life of Zelda Fitzgerald

Their brilliance and their excesses defined the age. And like the decade itself, their brief, tempestuous lives ended with calamity. The Crack Up: Fitzgerald’s Decline in the 1930s

F. Scott Fitzgerald, the admired writer we know today, spent his last years in emotional and financial ruin, convinced that his work had come to nothing. In 1936, just four years before he

died at age 44, Fitzgerald wrote several gloomy autobiographical essays that describe his sense of failure. They are, according to one writer, “part self-autopsy and part funeral sermon.” In

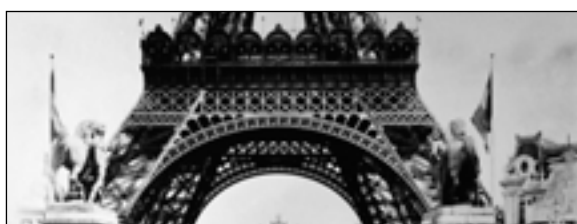

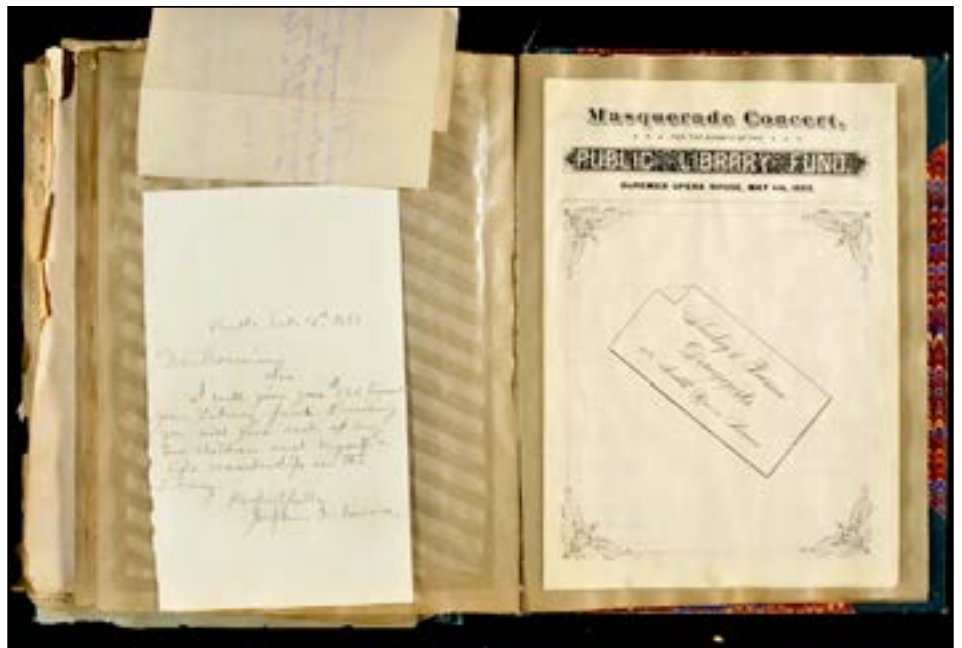

PCCLD scrapbook in the running for Colorado's 2014 Most Significant Artifact!

Dr. Richard Corwin's scrapbook in the Special Collections at Rawlings has been selected for public vote for the *2014 Colorado's 10 Most Significant Artifacts Campaign*. The collection features the academic views of medical doctors during the time Dr. Corwin lived (1852-1929). In 1881, General William J. Palmer, hired Dr. Corwin, 28, and two male nurses to work at Minnequa's six-bed hospital, which was a joint venture with the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad. Dr. Corwin was a fascinating character who settled in Colorado with a deep interest in taxidermy sharing his collection with the public.



Dr. Richard Corwin's Scrapbook offers a glimpse into Pueblo's history. The scrapbook has items that have not been saved anywhere else from the time including images, clippings and ads.
