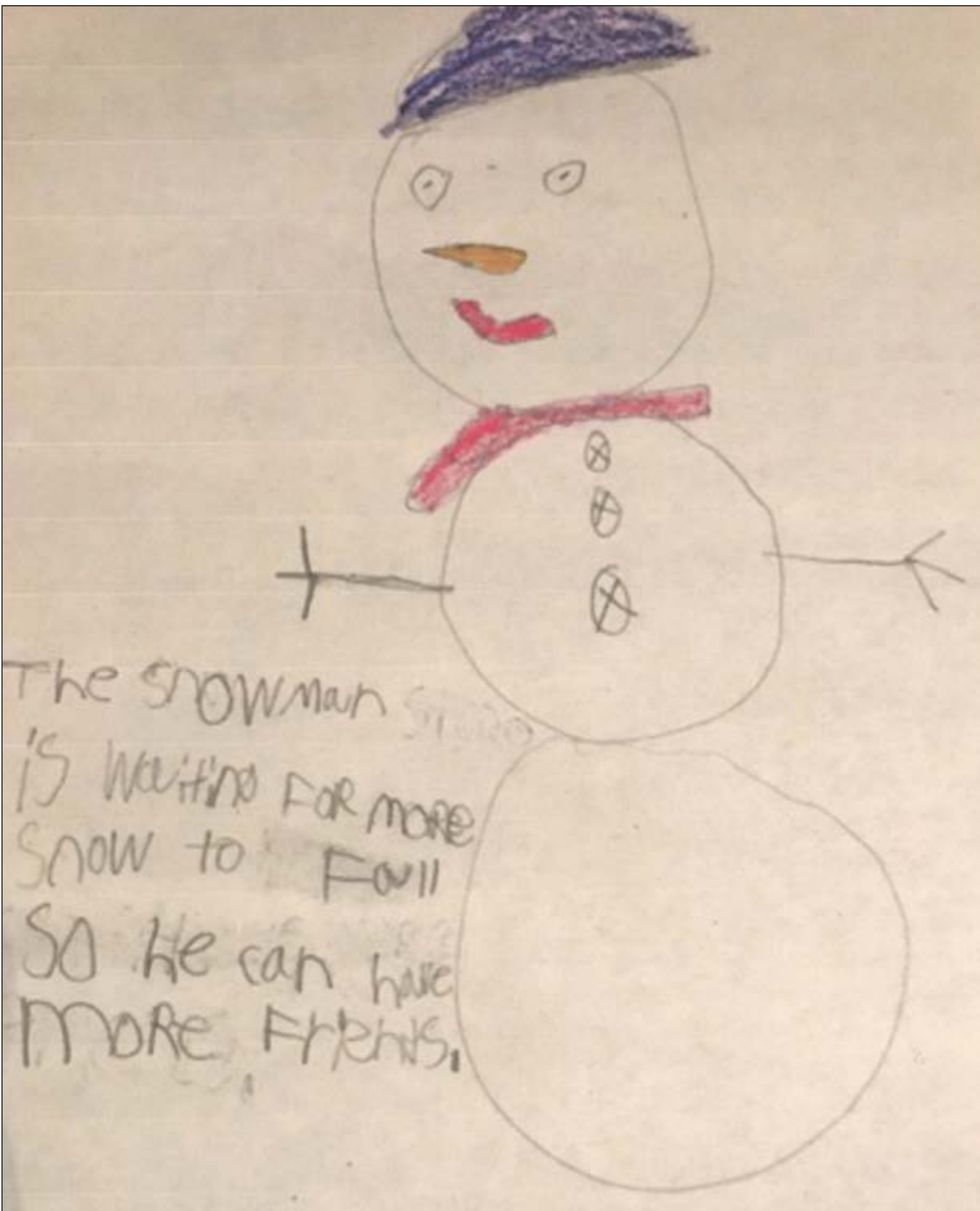
The Christmas cookie is under the rainbow and next to the moon.
